Dear Parents,

We open the week with a 26° spring day.... Fantastic! It has been a long, dreary winter and our bodies need a serious hit of Vitamin D. I hope this weather continues for the school holidays next week.

1 BARKLY STREET SALE

As most families will have seen in the Herald Sun, The Age and the Channel 9 news last Saturday, the house at 1 Barkly Street (that abuts our school) sold at auction for \$3.4 million. The Parish had a strong interest in purchasing the property not only for the children of today, but also looking to the future where our projected numbers through to the year 2035 are expected to grow to 470 (currently at 300).

The Archdiocese of Melbourne, that conducts all property acquisitions on behalf of schools, had the property valued in March 2015 and then again more recently by Charter, Keck and Cramer. Our bidder was then allowed to go to current valuation with a 10% discretion. Unfortunately for the school, the property sold well beyond this and for an East Brunswick record. Father Michael and the Parish fully supported the purchase and were happy to fund 50% of the purchase price. The other 50% would come from a 20 year loan paid for by the school.

The intentions for the property are not yet clear with mixed reports in the newspapers. However Catholics have always been people of hope and we will do our utmost to achieve the best outcome for the school. I will keep you posted with any further developments.



ITALIAN DAY NEWSLETTER

Let's celebrate Forza Italia Day!

Thank you for taking the time to read this newsletter. It will give you many details regarding this year's Italian Day festivities (<u>Wednesday</u>, 14th October) and hopefully will answer any questions you may have concerning your child's involvement on the day.

This term the students have been working on a unit in Italian with a focus on learning about Italian icons. Italy has many symbols that represent what is unique about the country, reflecting different aspects of its geography, cultural life and history. These icons have become famous worldwide and the Italian cultural influence is very much visible in this country too from Italian cuisine, fashion labels and products. Hence, I have tried to match the theme for the day – Forza Italia! (Go Italy!) to compliment what they have been learning in their Italian lessons and extend their learning in an entertaining way. In so doing we are celebrating and showing an appreciation of Italy's vast array of cultural icons! It is also a good opportunity to be reminded of the benefits of learning a second language and how it teaches us to respect other cultures and also enriches our understanding of our own language and culture.

Our Forza Italia Day! on October 14th will involve a variety of classroom activities and competitions for all the children. Please encourage your child to participate in as many activities as possible so that they are ensured of having a memorable and entertaining day!

The celebration day will begin with a costume parade in the assembly area around 9a.m. (weather permitting). You are very welcome to be present at this event and cheer the students on as they take part in the parade. Please support your child by helping them put together a simple costume for this event. This does not need to be anything expensive as children can make use of what they already have at home or they may even create parts of their costume with readily available materials. They are encouraged to wear a costume relevant to the theme (i.e. something related to Italian icons, of course you can throw in lots of green, white and red too!). See the list at the end of this newsletter for more specific ideas.

During the course of the day, students will also be exposed to some theatrical entertainment. The Comica Variety theatre group has been booked to perform the bilingual show "La Festa Italiana"; this show is provided for student viewing only. For the remainder of the day, students have an opportunity to engage in a variety of classroom games and activities appropriate for their level and related to the day's theme. Children who have placed an Italian-style lunch order will also be able to indulge in some pizza and gelato options on the day. All lunch orders should have been returned this week as orders will be processed and finalised during the holidays. As indicated in a recent newsletter, I am seeking volunteer helpers for the distribution of Italian Day lunches on this day from approximately 12.20pm -130pm, so if you can assist, please email me at: dpiovesan@olbrunswickeast.catholic.edu.au or ring the school on 9380 5050.

A number of Italian Day competitions have been put in place for students at no cost so if you hear your child talk about them at home, please encourage them to have a go at entering. It's all about participating and having fun! Each child has been asked to enter their level's colouring competition which focuses on a famous Italian icon. The Foundation children have completed their entry at school while the other children in recent weeks, were given permission to take their entry home for completion. All colouring competition **entries are now due** as it takes me many hours to put them all up on display and I would like to complete this task during the school holidays. This display will also form a visual and colourful backdrop for the day. Please take the time to admire the children's artwork once it is on display. All winners of competitions will be awarded a small prize.

The grade 5/6 children participated in an Italian Poetry Recital last week; this activity forms the basis for a competition as well as a formal assessment of their learning. Once the initial recitals are complete, a small group of finalists will then proceed to the next stage of the competition to be held early in term 4. Children will be notified of the date of this once finalists are announced. Buona Fortuna grade 5/6 students!

COSTUME IDEAS FOR FORZA ITALIA DAY! PARADE

Each year I encourage the children to dress according to the Italian Day theme. My aim is to add a different dimension of learning each year so they are not doing the same thing every year! It encourages the children to extend their classroom learning by thinking about an appropriate costume and perhaps even researching information about their selection. They could be encouraged to find out some facts about their Italian icon costume and share this with their class during the celebration day.

Hopefully the following list will give you enough inspiration. You can make it a full costume or even create a simple headdress to represent the theme: A celebration and appreciation of Italian Icons! Your child may enjoy contributing to the creation of their costume! Please ensure that any accessories are safe and comfortable.

Encourage your child to show an appreciation for the great array of Italian icons by:

- Creating a replica of their favourite Italian icon and wearing it! (E.g. pizza, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Ferrari, Vespa, Lamborghini, Colosseum, gondola, the Italian flag, spaghetti and meatballs, Italy's boot shape, cappuccino, gelato, etc)
- Printing a copy of various Italian icons and pinning them to a wearable t-shirt Some Italian icons could include: famous Italian bridges, famous Italian churches, Italian art, Italian food, Italian fashion labels, etc)
- Painting the names of Italian icons onto a wearable shirt.
- Dressing up as a famous Italian icon character (E.g. Pinocchio, Arlecchino, Venetian gondolier, pizza maker, Roman gladiator, Nintendo's Mario or Luigi, La Befana, Calimero, etc)
- Dressing up as an Italian soccer player or representing an Italian Soccer team. (E.g. Gli Azzurri, Juventis, AC Milan, Roma, Gianluigi Buffon, Alessandro Del Piero, etc)
- Dressing up as a famous Italian historical figure. (E.g. Leonardo Da Vinci, Michelangelo, Marco Polo, Galileo Galilei, etc)
- Dressing up as a Ferrari racing driver
- Creating a mask and dressing up to depict the famous Venetian Carnevale
- Dressing up in a traditional Italian folk costume

Hope these ideas are helpful and inspire you! Of course you can browse on the Internet for many more ideas. Whatever your choice, make it easy, inexpensive and try to get your child involved so that it enriches their learning!




