2026 Prep Information Night

On Monday 27th October OLHC will host a 2026 Prep Parent Information Evening starting at 7.00 pm. This evening will provide an opportunity for parents of children commencing Prep in 2026 to ask any questions they have in relation to their child starting primary school. We will explore the Prep transition arrangements OLHC has put in place and how you as parents and carers can support your child as they start their journey at primary school. Parents of existing students and new families to the school are encouraged to attend. Prep orientation sessions will then take place on the 6th and 13th of November 9.15 am - 10.15 am, concluding with the 'Step Up Afternoon' session 2.00 pm - 3.00 pm on the 15th of December.



Preparing Your Year 4 Child for Their First School Camp in 2026

It's completely normal for children to feel a mix of excitement, nerves and sometimes even fear when thinking about new experiences like their first school camp. There are several ways you can help your Year 4 child feel more confident and prepared for this next step in 2026:

Talk through specific worries: listen to your child's concerns and help them prepare together. For example, if they're worried about how to pack a sleeping bag, practise it at home. If they're anxious about trying new foods at camp, set a goal to try one new meal from a school camp menu each week as a family.

Encourage independence from home: if your child has never spent a night away, consider arranging sleepovers with grandparents, trusted friends or other family members before school camp. This can help your child feel more comfortable and confident spending a night or two away from you.

Encourage problem-solving: talk through possible situations they might face. For example, losing a sock or feeling homesick and discuss what they could do in each scenario. This builds resilience and self reliance.

Practice packing independently: make sure they can pack their bag on their own, including clothing, toiletries and any other essentials.

Promote positive talk about camp: share your own positive camp memories or speak to older students who have been before. Hearing others' excitement can make camp feel less intimidating.

There are many small steps you can take, and it's never too early to start. Preparing gradually helps make the experience exciting rather than overwhelming.

Parent Tips:

Getting ready for camp doesn't have to feel like a big task - you can make it fun! Try turning packing, trying new foods and sleepovers into little games or challenges and celebrate each success along the way. A small reward or word of encouragement can go a long way in building your child's confidence and helping them look forward to camp with excitement, not anxiety.

Why it matters:

Attending school camp gives children valuable opportunities to practise independence in a supportive environment. Experiences like being away from home, solving problems and working as part of a team help build confidence, resilience and responsibility - all essential foundations for success in the senior years of primary school and beyond.




