Dear Parents/Carers,

Today your child's Semester One report will be sent home indicating their level of progression throughout the term in relation to Religious Education and the Victorian Curriculum. Please take the time to read this report and speak to your child about their achievements. Staff look forward to discussing these reports and answering any questions you may have during Learning Conversations which will be held on Thursday the 24th of June. Please note these conversations will now be held virtually. As communicated previously to you earlier this week, your child will be required to attend this meeting as they will be sharing their learning goals. If your booking time is within school hours your child will be seated with their class teacher. If your booking is outside school hours please ensure your child is with you. Children will be dismissed at 3.30 p.m.

### INTERPRETING THE GRADES

Your child has been given an overall progression point which shows your child's achievement in each of the curriculum areas assessed this semester:

Well Above Standard - your child is well above the standard at this time of year.

Above Standard - your child is above the standard at this time of year.

At Standard - your child is at the standard at this time of year.

Below Standard - your child is below the standard at this time of year.

Well Below Standard - your child is well below the standard at this time of year.

Each curriculum area reported on has been broken down into a number of specific learning outcomes that have been taught this semester. Each skill has been assessed using a 5 point scale:

Standard not achieved - your child is not yet showing understanding of the standard.

Beginning to work towards the standard - your child is beginning to show an understanding of the standard.

Consolidating - your child is consolidating the standard.

At the expected standard - your child understands the learning standard.

Working above the expected standard - your child's understanding has moved beyond the standard.

A written comment is provided for English and Mathematics if your child is performing above the expected standard, is at the lower end of the expected standard or is below the expected standard. No comment will be provided if your child is at the expected standard as learning outcomes indicate the level of achievement obtained.
