Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been wonderful to see so many students and parents making a concerted effort to get to school on time. The gates open at 8.30am, your child should be at school at 8.45am so they can attend the morning assembly and be ready for learning at 9.00am sharp. We are now concerned that there are a number of students leaving before the end of the day. We understand that sometimes, students have appointments which are unavoidable, however it is expected that all students are at school until 3.30pm except for the odd occasion. This ensures that students don't miss out on any key learning and also minimises disruptions to classroom learning.

I would also like to take the opportunity to remind parents, carers and our community that there are strict parking guidelines around the school during pick up and drop off times. Council parking inspectors have been out and about lately and have been issuing fines. They will return randomly in the future and these days and times are unknown to the school. Over the coming weeks, we will once again be practising an emergency management drill. Schools are required to hold a drill at least once a term to test our emergency management response procedures. Parents and carers will be informed once this drill has taken place.

The Semester Two SRC and Social Justice student leaders met with Ms McIntosh and Miss McGrath last Monday. Leaders

were asked to gather student voices by asking their class - What suggestions do you have to improve OLHC? Student leaders also worked in collaborative groups to answer the following questions:

What are we doing to be safe at OLHC? How can we be safe at

OLHC? What suggestions do you have about child safety?

These responses will be used to create a Student Child Safety Charter.



National Science Week

This week we celebrated National Science Week. National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology. It aims to acknowledge the contribution of scientists, STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) professionals, innovators, designers and entrepreneurs in the field. This year, the school theme for National Science Week was Glass: More than meets the eye. Please see below a snapshot into the student's learning celebrating this event.





This week the Prep students engaged in numerous in-depth reflections, analysing chemical science experiments conducted in the classroom. As scientists, they have been developing their knowledge of the stages of matter, and how and why things change. During our Slime experiment, the Prep students

brainstormed ideas and listed possible predictions for the outcome of the experiment. They observed materials in their natural state and conducted the experiments to analyse whether their predictions were accurate.





As part of Science Week, Year 1 investigated some scientists famous that have invented some amazing and wonderful things around the world. Every student also created their own idea for a future invention, being inspired from all of the stories we heard. Hopefully one day can make their they inventions.

In Year 2 we have been donning our lab coats, putting our safety on glasses and investigating reactions that occur when we mix together different substances. So far this term, we have made ice cream in a bag, grown a salt crystal, increased the size of a solid Gummy Bear and inflated a balloon by creating gas in a bottle. We

follow the scientific method as we discuss our hypotheses and share our predictions about what might happen. This is a picture of the reaction that occurs when you mix bi carb soda and vinegar, creating the gas carbon dioxide.



The Year 3 and 4 students were lucky enough to have Fiona McGrath, Olivia (Yr.3) and Joshua's (Yr.6) mum speak to us. Fiona works at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute (WEHI), the oldest medical research institute in Australia. WEHI is

where some of the world's brightest minds collaborate and innovate to make discoveries that will help us to live healthier for longer. Fiona shared her knowledge of the scientific process, including safety precautions, her path to becoming a scientist and her current role researching biology and biotechnology. It was fascinating to hear about the scientific process and how researchers, such as Fiona, improve our lives and the lives of the plants and animals in the world around us!



Year 5 and 6 students celebrated Science week by creating kaleidoscopes. They learnt that light enters through the end of the

kaleidoscope and the pattern is caused when this light bounces back and forth between the mirrors. They were provided with the materials, including mirrored acrylic plastic, paper, cellophane and tape. In groups, students used their problem solving skills to collaborate and assemble the kaleidoscope.


