We pride ourselves in providing up to date and timely information to parents so they can be as organised as possible to support their children. School Newsletter - Our school newsletter is published fortnightly on a Friday Week 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9. This is emailed directly to you and is also uploaded to our school website each fortnight. The newsletter contains important dates and reminders for the term.

Termly Curriculum Overviews - At the beginning of each term parents will receive an overview of what the focus of learning is in core curriculum subjects and our specialist programs. These will be emailed directly to you and can also be found on our school website.

Medical Conditions

Your child's health and safety is extremely important to us. We therefore need to know about any medical conditions your child has. Please provide the school with a valid Action Plan and medical kit if

required, such as Ventolin, spacer and Epipen®. The Action Plan must be completed in consultation with your family doctor and should be returned as soon as possible. Your child's Action Plan will need to be reviewed annually in order for attendance at school excursions and camps.

If your child requires medication during school hours, please provide our administration staff with the medication and complete the Medication Form indicating permission to administer the medication, in its original packaging with clear instructions for example dosage, frequency etc. Medical Forms are located at the office.

Concessional Fee Policy

We are pleased to announce the continuation of the Concessional Fee Policy to assist eligible families in accessing a Catholic primary education for their child/ren.

The Concessional Fee is an amount determined by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) and covers the School Fee, Building Fee and Curriculum Levy (excluding Camp). Other Levies, such as Camp, are not covered and will be charged in addition to the Concessional Fee. Please note that the Concessional Fee already factors in any eligible CSEF discount (as discussed above) and does not result in a further reduction of the Concessional Fee.

To access the Concessional Fee, eligible families must also enter into an automated payment plan, either through CentrePay or Direct Debit.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.


