Ash Wednesday Mass

Next Wednesday, 5th March, is Ash Wednesday. This day marks the beginning of Lent and we will be celebrating with a whole school Mass at 11.00 am. Students will be invited to receive Ashes on their forehead and make a commitment to turn away from the temptation of poor choices and follow Jesus' teachings, as they prepare for Easter. Mass will begin at 11:00 am sharp and as always, all families are welcome to attend.

Shrove Tuesday

Prior to the commencement of Lent on Ash Wednesday, a Catholic tradition is to eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. To enable themselves to fast throughout Lent, early Catholics used all of the 'luxurious' foods in their pantries - milk, butter and eggs.

All classes will be following this Catholic ritual on Tuesday, 4th March. Students will be offered a pancake with their choice of toppings such as jam, butter, lemon juice and sugar.

Project Compassion

School Uniform Reminder

A reminder of Summer uniform requirements for students.

Black shoes - recommended with closed toe. There is a choice of two school hats - either the Legionnaires Hat (one size fits all) or Slouch Hat (S, M or L) can be worn. If cold, the navy jumper &/or Bomber Jacket can be worn. Tracksuit tops can only be worn on Sports Days.

Children are to wear runners on their allocated PE day, black school shoes are to be worn every other day.

GIRLS: Summer dress, white socks (above the ankle), hair ties to be in school colours only (gold, green, navy).

BOYS: Short-sleeved blue shirt, grey shorts, grey socks.

Please note the following:-

Jewellery: No nail polish, make-up or jewellery is allowed. For pierced ears, studs only are acceptable due to danger of injury when playing games. Chokers, dangly earrings or chains worn outside clothing are considered too dangerous for school days.

Hair: Students with longer than collar-length hair must have it tied back at all times with plain blue, green or yellow elastic or 'scrunchie.' Hair bands can be worn, but must be plain blue, green, yellow or in Summer: checked (if same material as uniform). No extreme hairstyles or colours in student hair.



School Photographs - Thursday 20/3/25

This year's school photographs are on Thursday 20th of March. Please ensure all students are dressed in their Summer Uniform (not Sports uniform), with black school shoes, white socks for girls and grey socks for boys. If your child has PE scheduled for Thursdays, you may pack your child's runners in their school bag to be changed for their lesson

All students will be photographed for school ID, regardless of whether parents will purchase photos or not. Please refer to the attached flyer for details on how to order your child/ren's school photos. Orders are encouraged to be made on-line, so we can avoid any cash handling issues.

Sibling Orders can also be ordered separately on-line. On-Line ordering for Sibling Orders cuts-off on 19/3/25.

If you do not have a credit card and wish to order a Sibling photo for all your children currently attending OLHC, please contact the office for a separate envelope form that needs to be returned with correct cash by 19/3/25.

At OLHC, we have developed and implemented Child Safe Standards in order help keep our students safe from harm. The Child Safe

Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all Victorian schools to ensure they are well

prepared to keep children and young people safe and protect them from abuse. The Child Safe Standards include requirements for schools including:

- involvement of families and students in child safety
- schools' focus on safety for Aboriginal students
- better management of child abuse risks in online environments
- governance, systems and processes for keeping students safe.

There are 11 Child Safe standards that schools must meet. Each year we have to communicate to you how we meet these standards. Each fortnight, we will share two with you and the measures we have in place to meet each standard. Please note all of our policies and Child Safe documentation is available to view on our school webpage which can be found at

This fortnight, we will be highlighting Child Safe Standard One and Two, the first being to establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued. This is a new standard that requires schools to make sure Aboriginal children and young people feel safe. This standard applies to all schools, even if there are no students who identify as Aboriginal. The term 'Aboriginal' includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It is important to be respectful of how individual children, students, their families and community refer to themselves, and use appropriate language. Cultural safety includes being provided with a safe, positive environment where nurturing and Aboriginal children:

- feel comfortable being themselves
- feel comfortable expressing their culture, including their spiritual and belief systems
- are supported by carers who respect their Aboriginality and encourage their sense of self and identity.

At OLHC, we implement and demonstrate this standard by valuing and respecting the different cultures of all our staff, students and families, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Child Safe Standard Two, requires us to ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture. This standard emphasises the vital role that school leaders and governing authorities have in establishing a culture where child abuse and harm are not tolerated and effective systems and processes to implement child safe policies and practices and manage child abuse risks are in place. Schools must take deliberate steps to promote child safety and wellbeing and protect children by:

- embedding and promoting a child safety culture at all levels of the organisation
- school leaders actively modelling such a culture by ensuring transparent governance arrangements are in place.

At OLHC, we implement and demonstrate this standard through developing, endorsing and making publicly available the following policies on our school website.

- Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy
- Child Safety Code of Conduct Policy.

We also make sure that all school staff and volunteers understand our Child Safe Standards and their obligations regarding Child Safe information sharing and recordkeeping.

School Attendance



Under the Education
Training and Reform Act 2006
(Vic.) and the Education and Training Reform

Regulations 2017 (Vic.), school attendance is compulsory for children and young people aged 6 to 17 years unless an approved exemption has been granted.

While ensuring school attendance is a legal responsibility of parents/guardians/carers, it is also a shared commitment between families, the school, and the wider community to support students in attending school every day.

Parents must ensure their child attends school daily and provide a valid explanation for any absences unless an exemption applies. Approved absences generally include (but are not limited to):

- Medical and dental appointments when out-of-hours options are not available
- Bereavement or attending a funeral, including participation in Sorry Business
- Cultural observances, where the school is informed in advance

Regular school attendance is essential for student success, helping young people stay on track academically, socially and developmentally. Students who attend school consistently have better long-term health, employment opportunities, and financial security.

These WWC checks are FREE (because it's for volunteering), easy to apply for, and valid for a number of years. The application requires taking a photo of a few forms of ID and yourself, but is quick and easy, with step by step instructions. The card can take several weeks to arrive, so we encourage everyone to head over to the below website and have this done in preparation for your volunteering. Once your card arrives, please take it to the office for Debbie or Cathy to photocopy. You'll be asked to enter your WWC ID number the first time you sign into the iPad, but can then set up a Quick PIN to make the sign in process super quick thereafter. Application:




