It is great to be back at OLHC after my recent Indigenous Culture Immersion Tour of the Northern Territory with 26 other Catholic Primary School Principals from neighbouring schools in the North Central region of Melbourne. It has been a joy and privilege to be welcomed back so enthusiastically by the community.

A huge thank you to Jackie McGrath who took on the role of Principal in my absence. As I expected, Jackie did a fine job in leading the community and ensuring that term three finished on a high note. Many thanks also to our wonderful staff and families for their support of Jackie during this time.

My pilgrimage to the Northern Territory was an experience I will never forget. I am eternally grateful for the opportunity to attend and know that it will hold me in good stead as I continue my professional journey as Principal. It was a privilege to be immersed in the culture of the indigenous communities in both Kakadu and Arnhem Land. By far the highlight was to experience the deep spirituality of Arnhem Land where I was able to walk on the sacred lands and view the amazing rock art that dates back tens of thousands of years. As we arrived in Arnhem Land our Guide asked us to acknowledge the presence of the spirits, respect the land and leave only our footprints. It was a deeply moving and powerful experience. At Our Lady Help of Christians we are committed to reconciliation with First Nations people and to working together to shape a future where diversity and justice are treasured. We stand together with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. # Inquiry Learning Focus: Culture & Community - Parents as Experts

This term our inquiry learning focus will be learning about community and culture. Students will be unpacking the concepts of identity, culture, diversity and community. In the TUNING IN phase of the inquiry journey we have asked students to share artefacts/objects that convey their own cultural heritage. In unpacking these broad concepts we begin this experience by understanding and knowing our own cultural heritage and identity. Sharing our cultural markers with others enables us to open our lens, and to acknowledge and appreciate the diverse community that we live in in

Australia and particularly at Our Lady Help of Christians. Some of the big compelling questions that the students will



be investigating include: What is culture and how does it create identity? Who are we and how do we know? How does culture influence the identity of people and communities? Who am I? What are we?

Students will be engaging in a variety of different experiences during this time in the FINDING OUT phase of the inquiry learning process. Across the school we will deepen our understanding of our First Nations people. On Monday 7th November we will welcome Wurundjeri Elder Ian Hunter to Our Lady Help of Christians who will share his culture and identity with us.

As a learning community, the students this year have enjoyed and benefited from our *Parents as Experts* guest speaker opportunities. These Guest speakers have shared their expertise to deepen and complement our inquiry learning focus throughout the year. Parent engagement in learning is a rich experience for all involved which is encouraged and valued in our learning community.

This term we are seeking any parents/carers who are willing to share their culture and identity with our community.

# Uniform Update-Reminder

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct school uniform, long hair needs to be tied up to reduce the risk of head lice. 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
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


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
