#### Dear Families,

This week brought the news that onsite operations in all schools across Victoria are due to recommence on a staggered timetable. Monday 25th May has been gazetted as a Pupil Free Day and children in Years Foundation, One and Two are due to return to their classrooms on Tuesday 26th May. The older children, in Years Three, Four, Five and Six, are due to return to their classrooms on Tuesday 9th June. As a school we are working through the protocols to be put in place to ensure identified risks are managed and that families can be confident that all care will be taken. These protocols will be sent out later this week.

Unfortunately, the return of onsite classes does not mean that it is business as usual for our school community. While the children will be able resume face-to-face classes, together with their classmates and teachers, we will be restricting the number of adults in the school meaning that parents will not be able to come into the school in the same way as they have previously, and our community gatherings will not be able to occur until further notice. We will be sending out our onsite protocols after they are finalised next week before staff and students come back into the school.

As society begins to move once more, it is important for all of us to remember that the crisis is not yet over. It is still necessary for adults to maintain social distancing practices that ensure we are 1.5 metres apart, that we continue good hand hygiene – regularly washing and sanitising hands, not shaking hands and coughing into elbows – and that we are aware of allowing adequate space for the small number of people we are allowed to gather with.

#### **FOUNDATION 2021 ENROLMENTS**

Traditionally, Foundation Enrolments officially open the first day of Term 2 each year. We are now placing a call out to all our current families who may have a younger child due to start school next year that you have submitted an Application to the School Office.

#### PARENTS ASSOCIATION MEETING




